We know that the world is a tricky place and as trans people, we have to face some particularly unique challenges when we encounter places that may not be quite ready for us.

School is hard enough as it is without having to worry about things like where to find a bathroom and who to talk to about changing your name. This zine will answer some common questions about your specific school and provide you with information that will make your experience a little easier.

We have also included some additional resources for support groups, scholarships, and social spaces, just for you.

The information you'll find here about JSD schools was gathered from a survey we conducted in 2024. This survey was sent to the JSD superintendent, principals, and some staff at each school. When creating this resource we aimed to stay as true as possible to what JSD staff wrote in their surveys. Some information may not feel complete, and some information may not be what you want it to be. We want to express our gratitude to the JSD staff who completed this survey. We also recognize there is more work to be done to make school both safe and easy to navigate.

What is a grievance?

A Student Grievance is the formal procedure you can use to report violation of the non-discrimination policy. You have the right to file a grievance if school staff is not following the policy. If you think you might need to file a grievance, get a trusted adult* involved to see if it's the right next step for you. A parent, guardian, or advocate can file a grievance for you, if you want. You deserve to have your rights respected!

Name Changes

Any teacher can input your chosen name into the "nickname" field in PowerSchool. This will inform other teachers, but will not change your name or remove your legal name in the system. This does not require parent or guardian consent.

Your name can be changed in PowerSchool even if it is not changed legally. To do this, you can request the name change form from the registrar, Donna Leigh in the counseling office or the principal, Paula Casperson. Complete the form and return it to the principal. She will sign it and forward the form to the district office who will make the adjustment in PowerSchool. This form also allows you to update your school ID. Students under 18 must

have a parent or guardian's signature on the form. Mandatory permanent records will still require a legal name.

Gender Neutral Restrooms

There are single stall restrooms near the gendered restrooms on each level of the building that are typically unlocked unless they are occupied. Locked single stall restrooms can be unlocked by a staff member. There are 2 gender neutral restrooms in the gym that are unlocked when the gym is open. There are also gender neutral restrooms in the nurse's office (RM 228) and Teen Health Center (RM 124) that are available when these offices are open (check page 16 for Teen Health hours at your school). The school nurse, your counselor or another adult that you trust* can help you navigate regular access to a bathroom.

Locker Rooms

You can use the locker room that you feel most comfortable using. If you have questions or concerns about locker room access, you can talk to the adult that is organizing or leading the activity. If you experience discrimination when using a locker room, refer to the info below to address the situation.

Gender Support Plan

The YDHS counselor will meet with trans & gender diverse students to develop a gender support plan. During this meeting, things like bathroom access and name change processes can be discussed directly with the counselor.

Name Changes

Your name can be changed in PowerSchool even if it is not changed legally. To do this, you can talk to the counselor or the principal. The principal will meet with you and your guardian to sign the form and go over it in detail to explain what will change and what is unable to be changed. If you are 18 or older, you will not need a guardian signature on the form. The form is then submitted to district staff who will make the change in PowerSchool.

If you would like to change the name that students and staff use for you, you can tell your advisor or the counselor and they will communicate this change to the rest of the staff.

Gender Neutral Restrooms

There is a gender neutral bathroom in the gym that is unlocked and available when the gym is open. The gym is almost always open during the school day. There is also a gender neutral bathroom in the nurses office that is available when the office is open. Staff from the front office or the counselors can let you into this bathroom if the nurse in not there.

Locker Rooms

If you have questions or concerns about locker rooms or other activities that are separated by gender, such as sports teams, you can talk to the principal, John Paul.

Name Changes

Your name can be changed in PowerSchool even if it is not changed legally. To do this, you can talk to the counselor or the principal. The principal will meet with you and your guardian to sign the form and go over it in detail to explain what will change and what is unable to be changed. The form is then submitted to district staff who will make the change in PowerSchool. If you would like to change the name that students and staff use for you, you can tell your teacher or the counselor and they will communicate this change to the rest of the staff.

Gender Neutral Restrooms

There is one gender neutral bathroom that is designated for staff, but can also be used by students as needed. This bathroom is unlocked and available throughout the school day. If you have questions or concerns about this, you can talk to your teacher, the counselor or the principal, John Paul.

Locker Rooms and Activities Divided by Gender

Montessori does not have locker rooms. You can talk to your classroom teacher, the counselor or the principal if you have questions or concerns about other activities separated by gender.



Name Changes





Gender Neutral Restrooms

There is a gender neutral bathroom in the gym that is unlocked and available when the gym is open. The gym is almost always open during the school day. There is also a gender neutral bathroom in the nurses office that is available when the office is open. Staff from the front office or the counselors can let you into this bathroom if the nurse in not there.

Locker Rooms and Activities Divided by Gender

JCCS does not have locker rooms. You can talk to the principal, Corey Weiss, if you have questions or concerns about other activities separated by gender.

Name Changes

Admin staff, such as counselors and principals, can put your preferred name in a "nickname" field in PowerSchool. This will show your preferred name to other staff, but will not remove your legal name from the system.

Your name can be changed in PowerSchool even if it is not changed legally. To do this, contact the registrar, Brenda English, in the front office. This will only apply to non legal documents. Things like official transcripts will still require your legal name.







Gender Neutral Restrooms

There is a gender neutral restroom in the library that is unlocked when the library is open. There is one single-user restroom located off of the commons by the art room that requires a code to access. You can request the code from the principal, vice principal or counselors. There is also a bathroom in the nurse's office.

Locker Rooms



SELF-ADVOCACY TIPS

Know Your Rights

There are certain protections you are entitled to. That means that *there are things the school district has to do to protect and support you*. Read, and have any supportive people in your life read, the Juneau School District's *Nondiscrimination: Transgender Student's and Employees Policy.* Refer to this policy when you are asking for things you need at school.

RECORDS On non-permanent school records or documents, the school will use the name and gender preferred by the student or employee...student ID cards should use the student's preferred name.

NAMES/PRONOUNS Administrators/staff should respect the right of an individual to be addressed by a name and pronoun that corresponds to their gender identity, including the use of gender-neutral terms. Legal changes aren't required.

GENDER SEGREGATED SPACES Upon request, the District will work with transgender students and parents (if applicable) to determine appropriate accommodations with regard to bathrooms and locker rooms...considerations can include safe and non-stigmatizing alternatives such as the addition of a privacy partition or curtain, use of a nearby private restroom or office, or a separate changing schedule.

Students shall be permitted to participate in any such activities or conform to any such rule, policy, or practice consistent with their gender identity.

Make A Plan

Self-advocacy is about standing up for yourself and asking for, and sometimes fighting for, what you need. It can be hard, and it helps to make a plan. Write it out first!

- 1. What is the problem or issue?
- 2. What do I need to ask for? Can I pull something from the policy that relates to my need?
- 3. Who do I need to ask? That answer might be in this zine!
- 4. Who can help me ask (see notes below on trusted adults)?
- 5. What will I do if my need gets met? What will I do if I don't get the answer I was looking for?

Take Care of Yourself

You deserve to have support! Utilize the resources in this zine to find peers and supportive adults who can help you get what you need at school. Take care of yourself by *finding spaces where you* feel safe and comfortable being yourself- that might be in an in person support group, an online space, or at the ZGYC. There are many trans adults and youth who want to connect with you and support you.

Lean on Adults That You Trust

Not everyone has supportive adults in their families or homes. It's important to find supportive adults who you can trust. You might find those supportive adults at your school, in the Teen Health Center, or at ZGYC. A supportive adult is someone you feel safe with, and someone who respects you. A supportive adult might go with you to a meeting at school, help you write an email, fill out a grievance with you, or talk to you about how you're feeling and be a good listener.



LOCAL RESOURCES

The Zach Gordon Youth Center

A free, drop-in center for youth. The center has a gender neutral bathroom and will ask for your name and pronouns when you sign in. There is also a pool table, foosball, art supplies, a library of free books, an Xbox, a variety of board games and a bunch more. Staff will always check in to see how you're doing, cook you food and cheer you on in life. After 6pm, you must be 14 or older to be at the center so the evenings are reserved specifically for teens. The center also hosts some LGBTQ2S+ specific groups and programs:

The Alliance, a drop-in, afterschool activity on Wednesdays for LGBTQ2S+ middle school students to connect weekly through the BAM (Body and Mind) Afterschool Program. Check in with the BAM coordinator at TMMS for more information.

Wellness Wednesdays, a drop-in lunchtime activity on Wednesdays for LGBTQ2S+ Youth and Black, Indigenous, and Youth of Color, and their allies to hang out, study, eat lunch, connect with other students, and be connected with resources alongside supportive adults. Room 214 (JOM Classroom)

Gender Support Group, this interactive psychotherapy support group is for individuals ages 12-19 who identify as transgender, gender expansive, genderqueer, and non-binary. It will provide a safe, affirming space to explore, process, and grow as we examine different aspects of our gender identity. Registration is required (see ZGYC staff). Groups gather on the 3rd Thursday of the month from 5-6 at the Zach Gordon Youth Center.

Gender Affirming Scholarship Fund

This fund can provide gender-affirming items to any youth, such as clothing, binders, makeup, etc. If you have questions or want assistance accessing this fund, contact NAMI Juneau at http://namijuneau.org/lgbtq2.



THE MORE YOU KNOW

Did you know that if you go to JDHS or TMMS you can meet with a Mental Wellness Clinician at your school? These adults can provide support for you and your mental health. You can talk to a supportive adult* in the school and they will connect you with the Mental Wellness Clinician, or you can email them directly using the contact information below.

The Teen Health Center

An in-school service for high school students that offers both medical and counseling services. Comprehensive services are free and provided either directly or by referral to other providers. Staff at Teen Health can assist with gender affirming supports.

Appointments at the health center are best scheduled in advance and are easy to make. Teens can drop-in to during the school day or call to make an appointment. HomeBridge and Home School students and unenrolled teens that are high school age can access services at the Teen Health Center.


